Anamika and I are establishing the APG Family Office, also known as the George Family Office, to give enduring structure to the convictions, work, and responsibilities that shape our life together. In our first year of marriage, this marks a commitment to steward our resources thoughtfully, support each other's aspirations, and build an institution through which our family can contribute across generations.

My family's roots lie in Kerala's Syrian Christian community. The history passed down to me encompasses banking, entrepreneurship, engineering, education, and church life. Across these pursuits, I recognize a shared commitment to building, teaching, and serving. This inheritance informs my understanding of family as a place where faith and practical responsibility are learned and carried forward.

Christian ministry has been central to that history. My paternal grandparents served village and tribal communities, supported congregations, and helped establish churches. My father's journey included serving as a librarian aboard ships associated with Operation Mobilization. My mother came to the United States at a young age and built her life through persistent work. Growing up in Georgia with blue-collar parents, I learned perseverance and responsibility alongside an openness to adventure. They encouraged me to pursue an independent path and trust God without knowing every outcome.

At fourteen, I began a self-directed journey into creative work and building systems. At twenty-six, I can see how those experiences have shaped my approach to opportunity and stewardship. Marriage has given that work a shared direction. Anamika and I first connected through design and Christian faith, developing a relationship across distance before I traveled to India to meet her. Our decision to marry grew from our love for one another and our conviction about the life we wanted to build. Establishing this family office is an extension of that commitment.

The principles guiding our home also guide this institution. We return to Jesus' promise of peace as a foundation for our relationships and decisions. We believe joy deserves deliberate cultivation, and we want to grow in affection for one another as we grow in our love for God. Mutual respect means helping each other develop our gifts and realize our aspirations. Stewardship means caring responsibly for the time, talents, relationships, and resources entrusted to us. We measure success through the faithfulness of that care and the good it makes possible.

Our family office is being established to coordinate our investments, creative and entrepreneurial projects, affiliations, and service. We intend to develop initiatives internally and support the work of others through our experience, skills, and resources. A physical office forms part of our longer-term vision, providing a place from which these responsibilities can develop as our family grows.
